

Faux Fur Poncho

Cozy, Cowly, Capey Furry Poncho

Sizing and Materials Details

Sizes: Small/Medium (Large/X-Large)

Finished measurements: Bottom Circumference: 58 (64)" Cowl Circumference: 28 (28)"
Length from shoulder: 19 (20)" Total Length (including cowl) 25 (26)"

Gauge: 5 stitches and 6 rows = 4" in stockinette stitch

Needles: US 17 (12 mm) 24" circular needle. *Adjust needle size as necessary to obtain correct gauge.*

Yarn: 216 (288) yards of superbulky weight (CYCA #6) faux fur yarn. Sample made with 6 (8) balls of Sirdar Alpine. Alternates: Knitting Fever "Furreal" or Lion Brand "Go for Faux"

Other Materials: stitch marker, tapestry needle.

Instructions

Cast on 36 (36) stitches LOOSELY and join in the round without twisting the stitches. Place a marker to indicate the beginning of the round.

Work all knit (stockinette stitch in the round) for one ball's worth of yarn (*about 6-7" from the cast-on edge*).

1st increase: *k8, kfb; repeat from * to the end of the round. 4 stitches increased. 40 stitches.
Work all knit until piece measures 4 (3)" from the last increase.

2nd increase: *k4, kfb; repeat from * to the end of the round. 8 stitches increased. 48 stitches.
Work all knit until piece measures 4 (3)" from the last increase.

3rd increase: *k5, kfb; repeat from * to the end of the round. 8 stitches increased. 56 stitches.
Work 3 (2) rounds of knit.

4th increase: *k6, kfb; repeat from * to the end of the round. 8 stitches increased. 64 stitches.
Continue working all knit until you're almost at the end of the 5th ball (5)"

5th increase: *k7, kfb; repeat from * to the end of the round. 8 stitches increased. 72 stitches.
L/XL only: continue in stockinette stitch until one ball of yarn remains and work a 6th increase row: *k8, kfb; repeat from * to the end of the round. 8 stitches increased. 80 stitches.

Both sizes: Continue in all knit until enough yarn remains to bind off and bind off LOOSELY – VERY LOOSELY.

Finishing

Weave in tails.

Abbreviations

k – knit.

kfb – knit into the front and back of the stitch. One stitch increased.
